All about the Number 16

Home Learning Challenges

Ask a grown-up to create a number hunt for you. Write the numbers 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 on pieces of paper (you will need several of each number). Then, hide them around the house. How many 16s can you find?

Can you do an active 16 challenge? Think of actions, such as star jumps, bunny jumps or hops, and do each one 16 times. Can you use 16 building bricks to build a tower? Would a tower of 10 bricks be shorter or taller than your tower? How can you check? What about a tower of 20 bricks?

Twin spiders, Spike and Spinney, buy some new shoes. They have eight feet each! How many shoes do they have altogether? Draw a picture to help you work out the answer.



Count out 16 raisins or other small snacks. Can you say how many

there would be if you added one more? What about when you eat one? Can you count backwards from 16 as you eat each treat?

Can you see the number 16 on this page? Can you trace over the numbers at the bottom of the page? You could try writing the number 16 on your own too.
